COACHING STAFF



OBU Head Track Coach Ford Mastin could fill a room with the honors he and his teams have won since taking over the program in 1996-97. Most prestigious among the awards are his 1998 & 2007 NAIA Men's Outdoor Track and Field Coach of the Year and his 2005 & 2007 NAIA Women's Indoor Track & Field Coach of the Year awards. He's also captured region and Sooner Athletic Conference coaching awards in cross country and track and field numerous times. His first women's cross country team set a new standard for the OBU program and has progressed to the highest rank of NAIA power. Since arriving in 1996-97, the OBU cross country and track and field program have produced more than 200 All-America awards under Mastin. On the national level, the Bison have had top 10 national finishes in each of Mastin's seasons including an Outdoor National Championship in 2007. The Lady Bison track teams have improved each year and reached the top 10 in indoor track for the first time in 1999. The Lady Bison then went on to capture the 2005 & 2007 NAIA Indoor National Championships.

COACHING STAFF



Coach Matt Kennedy moved to OBU to coach the jumps in 2006 from Midwestern State University in Wichita Falls, Texas, where he assisted with the women's cross country team during the 2005 season. Prior to MSU, Kennedy served for three seasons as the head track and field coach at Wichita Christian High School. Kennedy's squads finished among the top eight at the TAPPS State Track and Field Championships each of his three seasons. During the summer months, Kennedy continues to serve as the head coach of the Wichita Falls Track Club. A position he has held for the past five summers. The club has seen enrollment increase each of the past five years, resulting in more than 20 TAAF state qualifiers four of the last five seasons. This includes 32 state qualifiers in 2007 and the TAAF female State Athlete of the Year.

A graduate of Velma-Alma High School, Johnson earned a degree from OBU in 1999 and a master's degree from Oklahoma State University in 2003. At OBU, Johnson was a two time NAIA Track & Field All-American and won the marathon at the 1999 NAIA Outdoor Track & Field Championships. He earned three NAIA All-America Scholar Athlete awards as well as All-Sooner Athletic Conference honors three times during his OBU career. Johnson joined the OBU coaching staff in 2004 and was voted Sooner Athletic Conference and NAIA Region VI Men's Cross Country Coach of the Year in 2005, 2006 and again in 2007. He has led OBU's men's cross country team to 4th place finishes at the NAIA national cross country meet in both 2005 and 2006. Johnson has coached athletes to four track & field individual national titles, one individual cross county national title and thirteen All American certifi-



Mark Heard came to OBU with 23 years of coaching experience at the high school level. As the head coach in Elk City, Oklahoma his teams won 9 State Championships and 8 State Runner-Up titles in cross country and track & field. During this time, Coach Heard's athletes produced 85 All-State award winners. Coach Heard has been named Coach of the Year three times by the Oklahoma Track Coaches Association. In 1995 he was chosen as the Oklahoma All-Star Jump Coach, and in 1996 Coach Heard was selected as the Oklahoma All-Star Boys Team Head Coach. He has lectured at the Oklahoma Coaches Clinic, and has directed his own vault camps for the past 20 years. At OBU Coach Heard will continue to do what he does best, develop outstanding pole vaulters. With the best pole vault coaching record in Oklahoma high school history, Heard's vaulters won 14 state titles and 7 runner-up performances from 1989 to 2006, including 9 straight championships from 1995 to 2003 and a 1-2-3 sweep in 2001.
