- Serve as an advisor to psychology majors and minors
- Assist in recruiting students to the psychology program
- Keep accurate class records and submit reports and grades
- Keep regular office hours for advising students

- Serve on university committees and take an active part in shaping the work of the division
- Support and guide student research and practice
- Work regularly with faculty members from other disciplines

- Area of specialty is open, but must be able to teach multiple psychology courses
- Possess and demonstrate strong interpersonal skills, communication skills, and pedagogy
- Be able to conduct a college classroom to maximize the student learning experience
- Be able to adjust teaching methods to meeting student needs
- Be able to work effectively with students in individual advisement as well as small and large class environments
- Be able to relate to colleagues in the OBU community as well as be a representative to the professional community beyond OBU
- Be proficient in office technology, office software (including various Microsoft tools), and classroom presentation software
- Master's degree in psychology with hours toward the PhD degree
- Must be an active member of a local evangelical * church
