A master's degree with eighteen hours in the teaching discipline is required; Doctorate preferred. All positions are security sensitive and will require a criminal background check. When you apply, please include a completed cover letter, curriculum vitae, personal statement of Christian faith, statement of teaching philosophy and transcripts.

Job Role and Responsibility:

- Teach 1-3 courses per semester in English composition as assigned
- Prepare and distribute syllabi according to university policy
- Organize and direct learning experiences with assigned classes as outlined in the course syllabus and objectives
- Meet classes as scheduled and required
- · Keep accurate class records and submit reports and grades on time and as requested
- Be available during office hours
- Assist with departmental assessment of composition courses

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Knowledge and Skills:

- Able to conduct a college classroom so as to maximize the student learning experience.
- Demonstrate strong pedagogy with respect to curriculum and instruction.
- Able to communicate clearly and effectively with a variety of constituents.
- Able to assess student ability and adjust teaching as appropriate.
- Able to work effectively with college age students in classes of around 20 students.
- Possess and demonstrate strong interpersonal skills.
- Proficiency with office and educational technology, software (including various Microsoft tools), and classroom presentation technology.

- Preferred: Master's or PhD in English or a related field; experience teaching undergraduates in an accredited four-year college or university.
